Minutes of 22nd Meeting of Assam State Biodiversity Board held on 18th January, 2018 at conference hall of Chief Secretary, Assam, Dispur

The 22nd Meeting of the Assam State Biodiversity Board was held on 18th January, 2018 at the Conference Hall of the Chief Secretary, Assam, Dispur.

A list of those present in this meeting is at Annexure-I.

At the outset, the Board felicitated its new Chairperson Shri V. K. Pipersenia, IAS, Chief Secretary to the Government of Assam.

The Chairperson welcomed everyone present in the Meeting and requested the Member Secretary of the Board to initiate Agenda-wise discussions.

Agenda item-2:

1. The Minutes of the 21st Board Meeting were confirmed.

Agenda item-3:

- 2. The Board was informed of the actions taken on agenda of previous meeting as below:
 - i. The proposal of notification of threatened species of plants and animals was forwarded to the MoEFCC, New Delhi for consideration.
 - ii. The final version of short documentary films on following selected themes were received:
 - a. Subsistence value of Forests (11.35 minutes documentary)
 - b. Traditional Knowledge (11.04 minutes documentary)
 - c. Human-Animal conflict (11.30 minutes documentary)
 - d. Protected Area community interface (12.54 minutes documentary)
 - e. Life of a Forest Guard (12.50 minutes documentary)
 - It was suggested to upload all documentaries on the ASBB website, Facebook and 'YouTube' for awareness and easy accessibility by stakeholders.
 - iii. The following proposals of the Board were under consideration of the Government:
 - a. Amendment to the Assam Biodiversity Rules-2010.
 - b. Organizational structure and draft Service Regulation of the Board.

It was suggested a presentation be made to Additional Chief Secretary, Environment and Forests on both the proposals for expediting approval.

Agenda item-4:

- 3. The Board was informed that:
 - i. The 2nd Internship Program on Biodiversity Conservation held from on 7th of August to 9th November 2018, in which 16 interns participated and sixteen draft PBRs were prepared by these interns.

ii. As desired by the National Biodiversity Authority (NBA), documentary on Internship Programme on Biodiversity Conservation' that has been taken as the 'Best Practices' was shared with NBA and all State Biodiversity Boards.

- iii. Regarding Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs), the Board was informed about the following status:
 - a. BMCs have been constituted in all the 189 Anchalik Panchayats of the state.
 - b. BTAD: Against 21 Forest Ranges 16 BMC notifications have been received.
 - c. KAAC: Against 10 Forest Ranges 10 BMC notifications have been received.
 - d. DHAC: Against 9 Forest Ranges 6 BMC notifications have been received.
 - The Board desired that attempts be made to complete constitution of the remaining 5 BMCs of BTAD and 3 BMCS of DHAC within a period of one month.
- iv. The Board noted the following status on preparation of People's Biodiversity Registers (PBR):

a)	Approved by the TSGs	•	25
b)	Final draft received	:	60
c)	On-going works	:	48

The Board desired that PBRs preparation for remaining BMCs expedited.

- v. The Board also noted the status of formation of Technical Support Group in the State:
 - a. TSG constituted : 22 Districts
 - b. Yet to be formed : 11 (List at Annexure-II)
 - The Board suggested that a final attempt be made to complete constitution of TSGs at the remaining districts as soon as possible and in case of noncompliance by the districts the Board may issue the order of constitution of TSG in these districts.
- vi. On the status of research projects undertaken, the Board was informed that:
 - a. Final Report of the 'Insect Fauna Documentation Project' was received and being edited for publication of a user friendly book.
 - b. Final Report of '<u>Fish Diversity Project</u>' implemented by Dolphin Foundation has been received and placed before the Board. <u>The Board accepted the Final Report.</u>
 - c. The second half yearly report of the project '<u>Plant Diversity Assessment</u> of <u>Dima Hasao District</u>, <u>Assam</u>' is due in January 2018. The 2nd installment has been released.

d. Final Report of <u>Assam Biodiversity Strategy & Action Plan</u> (ABSAP)'document prepared by WII has been received and placed before the Board.

The Board accepted the ABSAP document.

- e. The second quarter progress report of the '<u>Assam Biodiversity Portal</u>' has been received. Accordingly, a new website has been launched http://assambiodiversity.indiabiodiversity.org for uploading data in the portal by users.
- f. The Board noted the progress of the project '<u>Enhancing conservation</u> <u>efforts in Hoollongapar Gibbon Wildlife Sanctuary</u>' implemented by Aaranyak, Guwahati.
- g. The work for publication of the multi coloured pictoral guide book <u>'Wild</u> <u>Orchids of Assam'</u> has been completed and the Book was placed before the Board.
- The Board suggested that 'new publications' may be formally released at the upcoming function of "World Wetland Day" on 2nd February 2018.
- vii. Nature Learning Centre (NLC), Assam: The Board was informed that he MoEFCC, Delhi had sanctioned a proposal for 'Establishment of Nature Learning Centre' in Assam under the National Mission on Himalayan Studies (NMHS) and sanctioned an amount of Rs 3,76,34,312/- for the three year project. The Principal Investigator is Mr. A. K. Johari, IFS PCCF & Member Secretary, Assam Biodiversity Board.
 - The Board suggested to send the acceptance of the project by signing the necessary 'Bond' and start the project. The Board also suggested to set up an Orchidarium at the proposed Ex-situ conservation site of Assam State Zoo cum botanical garden. The Board also suggested to expedite the possibility of developing the NLC at Sankardev Kalashetra where tourist inflow are good and at some other suitable locations other than Guwahati. The Board agreed that the works already sanctioned to the Assam State Zoo, Guwahati under the APFBC may be modified to conform to the requirements of NLC Project.
- viii. A new project on 'Documentation of tradable bio-resources and associated traditional knowledge from the local communities of Assam" for establishing Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS) Provisions' has been approved and sanctioned by the National Biodiversity Authority (NBA).
